1. Introduction

The Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 requires public sector contracting authorities with regulated procurement activity of £5 million or more per annum to have prepared a Procurement Strategy, and to publish an Annual Procurement Report each financial year. I am pleased to approve and publish the NHS Ayrshire & Arran report for financial year 2022-2023.

This report covers third-party supplier spend for the period of over £147,360,092. There were 46 regulated procurements awarded in this period with a lifetime contract value of over £25,218,482 securing best value and delivering high quality goods, works and services.

The procurement activity with the Board is an important factor in contributing towards the efficient operations and service delivery and our Anchor/Community Wealth Building ambitions. Our ambition to provide locally based services alongside more specialised services in regional centres or, in some cases, at a national level requires collaborative and strategic delivery of contracts. By working in partnership and by focussing our resources this has allowed us to provide the best services possible.

A number of reporting requirements are challenging to collate and further work will be progressed to report on these in the year ahead. An updated Procurement Strategy is also required to ensure continued compliance.

During the reporting period 2023-2023 NHS Ayrshire and Arran:

- Total procurement spend of £147,360,092 with 1,888 suppliers
- National Distribution Centre Spend of £11,817,403.44
- Awarded 45 Regulated Procurements
- Average invoice value was £78,051
- SME spend: 47.59%
- Accounted for 28.72% of Scotland spend in Scotland
- Local procurement spend in Ayrshire: 9.53%

2. Summary of Regulated Procurements 2022-2023

A regulated procurement is any procurement for supplies or services with a value over £50,000 and for works contracts with a value of over £2 million. A regulated procurement is completed when the contract is awarded and an award notice is published on the Public Contracts Scotland web portal. The table below shows a summary of all Regulated Procurements awarded by NHS Ayrshire & Arran between 01 April 2022 and 31 March 2023. 3. Review of Regulated Procurement Compliance

NHS Ayrshire & Arran is committed to ensuring all regulated procurements comply with both the Board's Procurement Strategy and all relevant legislation.

The most recent Procurement Strategy covers the period 2017 - 2020. Due to COVID 19, and a change in the Head of Procurement in August 2021, the Procurement Strategy has not been updated. However, the Procurement Scrutiny Group (PSG) provides an oversight of all Procurement activities within the Board. In addition, each regulated procurement is overseen by the Procurement team or a Designated Purchasing Officer (DPO).

4. Anchor/Community Wealth Building

Under our Anchor/Community Wealth Building strategy NHS Ayrshire & Arran is committed to maximising community benefits from its procurement activities and for NHS Scotland there is a general duty to improve the health of the population of Scotland. Community benefits delivered through contracts are one of the main routes to achieve this. These may include for instance seeking to improve employment opportunities for the population at risk of ill health including young people; those with a disability; and long-term unemployed.

This approach is underpinned by the NHSScotland Community Benefits Gateway (CBG) a free and easy to use online service that connects NHS Scotland suppliers with third sector community organisations within Scotland who are looking for assistance with community initiatives (needs). Registered charities can submit a community need to the NHSScotland Community Benefits Gateway and NHS Scotland will encourage our suppliers to bid against the need and support its delivery.

There were no community benefits delivered in Ayrshire & Arran between 01 April 2022 and 31 March 2023. Three community benefit needs were registered on the NHSScotland Community Benefit Gateway but they were not delivered by NHS suppliers.

The NHS Ayrshire & Arran Anchor/Community Wealth Building programme was established in August 2022. Since January 2023 work has been ongoing to promote the NHSScotland Community Benefit Gateway with new Ayrshire community benefit requests registered on the gateway from 01 April 2023.

Since 01 April 2023 NHS Ayrshire & Arran has introduced a community benefit requirement into appropriate contracts and tenders where the estimated value of the contract is equal to or greater than £50,000 for goods and services and £1,000,000 for works.

To support our suppliers, we have embarked on improving our procurement processes

Our new *NHS Ayrshire & Arran Quick Quotes leaflet* now provides suppliers with information on:what a Quick Quote is; the Quick Quote process; distribution of Quick Quotes on Public Contracts Scotland; the NHSScotland Community Benefit Gateway; and NHS Ayrshire & Arran procurement team's contact information.

To promote Community Wealth Building (CWB) and our work on community benefits a series of social media posts have also been published on NHS Ayrshire & Arran social media sites to:

- Encourage suppliers to register on Public Contracts Scotland portal to enable them to view our advertised procurement contract opportunities.
- Encourage both 3rd party organisations and NHS suppliers to sign up to and use the NHSScotland Community Benefit Gateway
- Advertise attendance of the CWB/Procurement team at relevant supplier engagement events including: P4H and the Supplier Development Programme Meet the Buyer conference.

To provide information to our Anchor and CPP partners the NHS Ayrshire & Arran public website includes a *Community Wealth Building Section* which includes some information on our CWB procurement work and provides a page which promotes the NHSScotland *Community Benefit Gateway*. Our staff Intranet (AthenA) contains a Community Wealth Building section and procurement pillar web page promoting our progressive procurement aims and work to our staff.

Our Anchor/CWB procurement pillar supports local businesses by encouraging early market engagement to raise awareness of potential opportunities to bid for NHS work. We work in partnership with other local public sector bodies and Anchor institutions including: other local NHS Boards and the three Ayrshire local Councils to collaborate on procurement opening up opportunities to local suppliers.

As part of our Anchor/CWB commitments we aim to engage with local suppliers involved in National Procurement Framework tenders and NHS Ayrshire & Arran quick quote contracts.

From January 2023 NHS Ayrshire & Arran began a series of face-toface supplier engagement meetings. Supplier engagement meetings facilitated discussion between our procurement department and NHS suppliers on:

- Future and existing contracts;
- Improvement to operation of contracts;
- NHS Ayrshire & Arran and supplier relationship;
- Forthcoming NP (National Procurement) Frameworks;
- Use of Social values (Fair Work, community benefits and sustainability) in contracts;
- The NHSScotland Community Benefit Gateway;
- Benefits to suppliers of Supplier Development Programme membership including training offered to suppliers by the SDP; and
- Provision of advice and support on how to bid for NHS contracts.

5. Procurement Local Spend

NHS Ayrshire & Arran is committed to make best use of its spending power when considering how goods, works and services are procured and to increase our local procurement spend. We take a balanced approach to ensure our procurement processes consider social, environmental and economic impacts along with price

and quality to improve our supply chain resilience in the face of economic variation or barriers to international and long-distance trade.

We recognise our procurement decisions can support the Ayrshire local economy where we are not constrained to utilise national procurement frameworks. Over the years recirculation of our spend in the local economy can help to retain wealth in Ayrshire communities supporting provision of local jobs, apprenticeships, providing local people with incomes and supporting community wellbeing.

The table below shows spend with suppliers whose invoice address is in our local authority areas demonstrating a gradual increase over time as a percentage of our trade spend (excluding spend with the National Distribution Service). NHS Ayrshire & Arran local percentage of total procurement value increased by 1.26% in 2021-22 to 9.53% in financial year 2022-2023.

6. Procurement and Net Zero

We are facing a Climate Emergency. Now more than ever NHS Ayrshire & Arran must do the right thing for both its people (staff and citizens) and the planet. In line with NHS Scotland's objective to meet its Net Zero carbon emission targets while achieving its wider Social Value priorities we are applying net zero and social value rating to all NHS Ayrshire & Arran purchasing. Where appropriate and proportionate, sustainability evaluation criteria have been added to the quality section of our tenders.

The Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 requires authorities to comply with the sustainable procurement duty where applicable. This includes a requirement to support Small and Medium Enterprise (SME), Third Sector Bodies and Supported Business organisations gaining public contracts. The Board seeks to ensure that we meet this duty by adopting the Scottish Government Procurement Journey methodology and templates.

On the 31 January 2022, NHS Ayrshire & Arran published it's Climate Change and Sustainability Strategy 2021-2032. The strategy sets out the aims that we must:

- Reduce our greenhouse gas emissions across our estate, activities, goods, and services;
- Meet the Scottish Governments targets- and achieve net zero by 2045;
- Establish a culture of stewardship where healthcare professionals are mindful of the resources they use;
- Deliver more sustainable care;
- Create a circular economy and stop incineration of medical waste;
- Design out pollution, keeping materials in use and contributing to regenerative natural systems;
- Promote use of our greenspace and tackle the ecological emergency by increasing and restoring biodiversity;
- Deliver on our Anchor ambitions and strategy by becoming a responsible anchor institution integral to the community in which we seek to care for.

The role of procurement in influencing the environmental impact of health sector operations is well acknowledged and sustainable procurement practices have the capacity to reduce a significant proportion of the health sector's greenhouse gas emissions. Ensuring that our products and services are compliant with environmental and social standards throughout their lifecycle, can be drivers for a significant shift towards inclusive, green economies.

The Sustainability Action Plan for Procurement includes the following aims:

- 1. All the products and services we buy will undergo an assessment of sustainability opportunities and impacts using the sustainable public procurement prioritisation tool, Scottish Government Sustainability test, and life cycle mapping.
- 2. Whole life cycle costing and mapping will become a core part of all procurements within our board. We will evaluate the environmental externalities including energy and water consumption, climate change mitigation, waste, and pollution prevention as well as acquisition, use, maintenance, and end of life costs during the procurement of relevant goods and services.

- 3. We will require high ethical and labour standards from all our contractors requesting our suppliers to provide us with equality and diversity policies and indicators like % of female leaders, and unrepresented groups. We will ask suppliers that they conform to the modern slavery act.
- 4. We will encourage our suppliers to exceed government guidelines for sustainability for purchasing not via national procurement frameworks including through external accreditations such as Food for Life, Red Tractor, Dolphin friendly, Soil Association, sustainable fish markets, FSC recycling content etc.
- 5. We will routinely engage with and communicate our sustainability commitments and expectations to our suppliers, encouraging suppliers to use resources sustainably in their own operations.
- 6. We will pro-actively engage with all key suppliers to understand their vulnerability to climate change disruptions and the resilience and contingencies within their supply chain during extreme weather events. We will identify the parts of our supplier chain that are at highest risk and will work with our suppliers to implement risk mitigations.
- 7. We will undertake to routinely monitor the environmental impact (CO2e and air pollution) associated with our supplier's transport and logistics, and work with them to find ways of minimising their traffic burden. We will ask our suppliers to demonstrate ways of how they will minimise burden through more efficient planned deliveries / fewer polluting vehicles / driving training.
- 8. The sustainability of hazardous substances and chemicals are reviewed as part of the procurement cycle. We will pro-actively seek to eliminate suspected hazards and switch to safer alternatives in all building materials, medical equipment, furniture, clothing, and PPE (Personal Protective Equipment).
- 9. We will proactively work with all relevant suppliers to minimise the adverse environmental impact of disposable single use items where their use is unavoidable. We will identify all products where this is feasible and specify in our contracts that disposable products should incorporate a high minimum recycled content and are fully recyclable.
- 10. We have committed to increase our spend with SME's, third sector bodies and supported businesses for products and services. We pro-actively engage with potential suppliers to support and facilitate their involvement in our procurements. We will create a process to award contracts to directly to SME's, third sector bodies and supported businesses where appropriate.

7. Supported Businesses

NHS Ayrshire & Arran as a responsible Anchor institution are committed to facilitating the involvement of supported businesses in competition and the award of business

through our procurement processes. In 2022-2023, £35.33 was spent with the supported business, Lady Haig's Poppy Factory.

CCL North were awarded a contract with NHS Ayrshire & Arran to recycle end of life IT equipment. The contract is shown as having a £0 value as it incurs no cost to the Board as the business model is based on generation of income through re-purposing components. CCL North are based in North Ayrshire and have a staff count of 31 of whom 14 are from disabled and disadvantaged backgrounds. CCL North are working to introduce an apprentice training programme specifically for their industry and anticipate recruiting at least 10 new apprentices into their business over the next 3 years.

8. Proposed Regulated Procurements 2023-2024 and 2024-25

NHS Ayrshire & Arran Contracts Register is publicly available and states the start and end date of all contracts. The current contracts register can be viewed at: https://www.nhsaaa.net/wp-content/uploads/NHSAA-CR-OCT-2023.pdf.

The end date of each contract has been used to develop a work plan for the next two financial years. 45 regulated procurement contracts with a total estimated value of £89m are anticipated to be awarded by 2024-2025. In addition, 32 new requirements have been identified that are expected to be awarded by 2024-2025. A summary of this work plan can be found in **Appendix 2**.
