

Recovery Out of Alcohol and Drugs Support

ROADS Team - Referral Pathway

The Roads Out of Recovery Alcohol and Drug Support (ROADS) Team will support you to consider, prepare for and access long term **Residential Rehabilitation in Scotland**, and will also provide you with **continued support** when you return to the community. The team will support you to ensure long term residential rehabilitation is the right choice for you, and to consider areas such as housing and benefits. The ROADS Team can also offer **support to families**, **carers and children** of individuals who are going to long term residential rehabilitation.

Who can be referred to the ROADS Team?

You can be referred if you are:

- A resident of South Ayrshire.
- Affected by problematic alcohol and/or drug use, and if you are struggling to obtain recovery in a community setting or have experienced a recent non-fatal overdose.
- Willing to work towards abstinence-based recovery.
- Will to actively take part in a intensive six week pre-placement programme, and a supported aftercare programme.
- Willing to take part in an intensive 3 to 6 month residential programme.

How can a referral be made to the ROADS Team?

You can also ask your worker from RecoveryAyr/ADP, START, Ayrshire Council on Alcohol, We Are With You, Connect4Change or Justice Social Work Service, to make a referral on your behalf.



what happens next?

When we receive your referral, we will contact you to arrange an initial appointment to discuss your needs further and tell you more about what the ROADS Team can offer you. We will also discuss the support we can offer your family. We will also seek your consent to speak to other organisations who are providing you with support.

The ROADS Team is a multi-agency and multidisciplinary team involving staff from We Are With You, RecoveryAyr and Barnardos, who are working in partnership with South Ayrshire Alcohol & Drug Partnership.











ROADS Team - Referral Pathway



You can make a **self-referral to ROADS**(to consider, prepare for & access residential rehab) if you live in South Ayrshire & are 18 or over.

If you prefer you can **speak to your worker** at ACA, We Are With You, START or RecoveryAyr to make a referral on your behalf.

Referral can be made to team ROADS by **calling**, **emailing**, or **dropping in** to the service.

We will make contact with you to arrange an appointment within 72 hours.

We will discuss **your needs** with you.

We will also work with your other workers/services

If residential rehab is going to meet your needs we will **support you to plan** for this.

We will provide a **6 week pre-rehab structured** support with us.
We can also support your family.

We will **continue to support** you and link with the rehab to plan for the end of your stay at residential rehab.

When you **finish your stay** at residential rehab we will be there to support you.

If residential rehab does **not** meet your needs.



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We will be there to support you to link with other options.

Before you move on from the service you will be **guided to build a support network** ie community based support or treatment, education, employment, volunteering or other areas of your choice.
